BIBLE BOWL – BOOKS OF JUDGES AND RUTH

There are three divisions in Bible Bowl. All questions will be from the **New King James Version**. The **Junior Division** (ages 8-12) and the **Senior Division** (ages 13 – Senior High) will be using a paper score sheet. Judges will collect and score each round. Each round consists of 10 questions. The top scorers will participate in the championship final. Proper preparation will require studying the Books of **Judges and Ruth**.

The **Beginner Division** (age 3 - 7) is in center format. Students rotate through each center display and complete certain tasks to learn lessons from the **Books of Judges and Ruth**. There will be an adult at each center to help with instructions and to do any reading necessary to operate the center. Advance study and preparation is helpful, but **not necessary** for these little ones. **Please, women and children only in this session.**

STUDENT PROJECTS AND PRESENTATIONS

Tuesday and Wednesday evenings are designated for student presentations. **We encourage theme related presentations.** The deadline for registering for these presentations is **SEPTEMBER 16**TH. A WORD TO THE WISE

MISCELLANEOUS ROOM INFORMATION

- **Room keys: If you lose your key you will be charged \$10.00 by LWCC.
- **If you lodge at Parkside Lodge you must bring all of your bedding. There is a full-size beds and 3 Bunk Beds with Twin XL mattresses.
- **Eating is allowed in all rooms, but let's be very clean and careful. We desire to maintain a good reputation for leaving a facility in good shape.
- **Crock pots are allowed outside at the pavilion near the campers and inside where there is a kitchenette. The Lake Williamson management asks us to be careful not to overload circuits or spill food on carpets. In general watch for fire
- **Verification will be sent by e-mail or telephone concerning your lodging selection.

PETS

We will no longer allow dogs at RoundHouse unless they are certified companion dogs or service dogs!!! Also, pets are not allowed in any buildings unless they are service animals.

CAMPING SUGGESTIONS

If you are tent camping, we've learned through experience to put plastic or vinyl between your tent and the ground. In case of rain or heavy dew it is also good to have something over your tent. Tenters and RVer's share the same area. Do as much cooking ahead as possible to shorten your preparation time. Verification of your site selection will be sent via e-mail or telephone.

SPORTS

There are many play areas at LWCC: softball, soccer, volleyball (indoors and out), basketball, disc golf, putt-putt golf (inside and out), human foosball, pool tables, ladder ball, ping-pong, air hockey, black light dodge ball, archery, fishing (no license required) and more! LWCC furnishes the equipment **IF YOU BRING YOUR OWN SPORTS EQUIPMENT, LABEL IT WELL. USE AT YOUR OWN RISK.**

OTHER ACTIVITIES

There will be daily devotion times, a treasure hunt, a spelling bee, an arts and crafts tie-dye session (either bring your own white shirt or order a RH white shirt), tiny tot Olympics, and lots of wonderful fellowship. The ball fields do not have bleachers, so blankets or chairs will be necessary.
